

SERIES OVERVIEW

The Bible can be somewhat overwhelming for middle school students. How do I read it? How do I understand it? What do I do with what I read? These are all questions we will address as we try to make this *long story short*.

BOTTOM LINE

You can know Jesus today!

SCRIPTURE

John 6:35 (NIV)

DISCUSSION GUIDE

Small Group Leaders, use the questions below to guide your conversation.

CONVERSATION STARTERS

- What are some ways we stay in contact with people today?
- Which modern way(s) do we wish we could use to talk to Jesus?

EXPLORE THE BIBLE

- O When Jesus came to earth, he split history in half! What does that tell us about him? (He was a real person. He is important. I should pay attention to what he said and did.)
- O What do we have that helps us know Jesus better? (His life story and words)
- O Pull out your Bible and find John 6:35. Someone read Jesus's words out loud.
- O What does Jesus mean?

To help them think critically: What is bread? What does bread do? What do you think Jesus meant when he said bread of life? What might Jesus do to be the Bread of Life? Do you think he literally means you won't be hungry or thirsty? If not, what might the deeper meaning be?

O What can I do differently?

To help them think critically: If Jesus gives us what we need to do life, what can you do differently? Is there anything you can ask him for? Is there a different way for you to talk with him? Can you trust him differently? Would you worry less?

READING PLAN

- O Pass out the Bible Reading Plan. Have students find each Scripture passage for that week in their Bible. Use the sticky notes to bookmark each passage for easy finding.
- O What day and time do you want to read the Bible this week? How can you remember?
- If you read last week, do you have any tips for the rest of the group?

LEADERS – Be present with your students on this Bible reading journey! Here are some ways you can be present: Text them Monday to remind them to read. On Wednesday, ask what they're learning or if you can help. On Saturday, share what you're learning!
